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About the College:

Birjhora Kanya Mahavidyalaya, Bongaigaon, a premier institute of higher education for women in Lower Assam, was established in the year 1993. The initial objectives of establishing this institution was to disseminate knowledge & skill to the women of nearby areas of Bongaigaon district. Located at the heart of the Bongaigaon town, the college is very well connected both by road and rail communication.

An institution of higher education solely for women was a long felt need of the region. This need brought together a likeminded group of Philanthropists led by Mr. Phani Bhushan Choudhury, MLA of Bongaigaon and sprouted a dream by the name of Birjhora Kanya Mahavidyalaya. Thus, the college first started its journey with just 50 students and 7 faculty members. But today the college has grown into an institute of excellence with more than 800 students and 34 faculty members. Initially the college was started only with the Higher Secondary stage, but subsequently it started the undergraduate courses (B.A) in 1995. The college was accorded affiliation by Gauhati University and recognized by the UGC under sections 2 (f) and 12 (B) of the UGC act. At present the college offers UG courses for Arts in both honours & regular. Apart from this the college also has study centers of KKHSOU which offers various UG and PG courses through distance mode.

Birjhora Kanya Mahavidyalaya provides a unique and ideal learning atmosphere to the students for their all round development. Apart from scholastic activities the college gives equal importance to the co-scholastics activities, to help the students to develop as an individual with integrity, emotionally and mentally harmonious, physically capable as well as socially and culturally educated. With a team of competent faculty members the college is committed to empower the women of the region.

To develop Birjhora Kanya Mahavidyalaya into a centre of excellence in higher education for women by providing comprehensive & balanced education.

Institutional Weakness:

- Lack of residential accommodation.
- Less number of sanctioned posts both in teaching & non teaching as per requirement.
- Less number of skill oriented courses.
- Lack of consultative & placement opportunities.
- Lack of financial support to teachers for academic & professional growth.
- Inadequate infrastructural facilities such as Auditorium, Indoor Stadium, Gym etc.
- Limited resources in the use of digital technology to enhance teaching-learning process.
- Lack of Research projects.

Institutional Opportunity:

- Emphasis on enhancement of women education to make a better society free from gender bias and discrimination.
- Free & Congenial atmosphere for girl students of the region.
- Linkage between students of rural & urban areas thereby enhancing the benefit to learn from diversity reputed experiences.
- Separate plot of land of 20 bighas may be used for starting other streams (Science/Commerce) for girls.
- Being located at the heart of the town the College has some industrial supports.

Institutional Challenge:

- Majority of the students being from rural areas are not techno savvy.
- Implementing online courses through SWAYAM, MOOCS etc.
- Least opportunity for implementation of any new curriculum/course.
- Instilling competitive urge among students due to poor communication skill.
- Promoting research culture among students & faculties.
- Introduction of add on vocational courses for enhancement of employability.

Process of the Perspective Plan:

Perspective development plan is the blueprint of efforts made by the institution to develop itself as an institute of excellence. It also helps an institution to achieve its vision and mission. The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) is meant for planning, guiding and monitoring Quality Assurance and Quality Enhancement activities of the college. The initiation of preparing the perspective plan has been taken by the Internal Quality Assurance Cell for formulation of the perspective plan. The IQAC took into consideration the feedback received from NAAC and all stakeholders and incorporated them in preparing the Perspective Plan.

The perspective plan of Birjhora Kanya Mahavidyalaya for the period of 2023-24 to 2038-39 has been prepared by the IQAC from the academic year 2023-2024 to 2038-39 by taking into consideration the quality indicators of seven criteria.

Aims and objectives of Perspective Development Plan:

1. To create a congenial academic environment with sincerity, discipline and commitment.



- 2. To provide a platform to the students by giving them an opportunity to face the challenges in the competitive world, with utmost utilization of their potentials in the academic programmes, sports and other co curricular activities.
- 3. To ensure maximum utilization of all resources human, financial and physical for the holistic development of the institution.
- 4. To emerge as a model girls college for quality education.
- 5. To prepare for upgradation of Grade in 2nd Cycle of NAAC assessment.

Institutional preparedness for NEP 2020

In order to be prepared and fulfill the objectives of NEP, our college has started preparing the roadmap for NEP and started creating the required infrastructure. We are also using innovative pedagogy methods and techniques like Blended learning and e-learning through ICT to provide augmented multidisciplinary learning experiences to our students.

- Multi-disciplinary/ Interdisciplinary: Being an affiliated college, Birjhora Kanya Mahavidyalaya follows a course structure and the content for pedagogical transaction designed by the parent university (Gauhati University). Since 2019 the college is following CBCS curriculum which focuses on multidisciplinary subjects having significant benefits and far-reaching effects for the students. Students can opt for Generic Elective from other than their course study. In order to give students a wider exposure, college level invited lectures and conferences, seminars, special talks organized by departments give students a deeper understanding of other disciplines.
- The college is preparing to implement NEP 2020 as per the guideline of the affiliating university (Gauhati University) from 2023-24. As a single stream college, there are various limitations for implementing NEP courses. However, the college is still carving out the ways for the fruitful implementation of multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary education which can enable the students to develop as envisaged by NEP 2020. NEP related seminars and workshops are also organized to orient students as well as the staff and the management. Staff members are also provided opportunities to attend similar training, and seminars organized are being planned to prepare a roadmap for incorporating the features of NEP 2020.
- Academic Bank of Credit: The institution's preparedness on implementation of ABC depends upon the guidelines of the affiliating university and Director of Higher Education, Assam. Under the prescribed CBCS curriculum being taught presently, there are credits assigned to papers and it allows students' mobility across higher education system and flexibility to experience diverse learning. by other institutes. The credits are awarded based on number of contact hours spend per week in different classes, along with the internal and external examinations marks.
- **Skill Development:** The institution is already conducting skill courses as designed by the affiliating university since 2019. The college offers SEC in the curriculum for undergraduate students of 3rd, 4th and 5th semester. The college has also started a certificate course on Cutting and Tailoring and Beauty and Bridal makeup which will

later be developed into a full-fledged vocational course. The institution also has signed MoU with Medhavi Foundation and Skillfinity for providing training to students in skill development. Apart from this the institution is also taking initiation to develop more skill based courses in line of NEP 2020.

- Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge System (Teaching in Indian language, Culture, using online courses): The college ensures appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system by offering MIL and core courses as per CBCS scheme set up by parent University.
- The Department of Assamese is taking an initiation in integration of Indian Knowledge system by providing an online diploma course on 'Asomiya Bhakha Sikhya Pathyakram' in association with Asom Sahitya Mukta Sikha Sansad. The course aims at providing the knowledge of Basic Assamese Language to those students who did not learn Assamese as a subject in their school life. The students are mostly non-assamese.
- The literary and Cultural forum of the college organises various activities for promoting the rich art and culture of the region. Besides these, different workshops are organized from time to time to provide students a wide and varied exposure to this. The college also celebrates different festivals by involving students with an aim of exposing them to Indian culture and tradition.
- Focus on outcome based learning: The learning outcome of different programmes offered by the college is formulated by each department. The final outcome expected of students at the end of a particular programme and the desired skill and knowledge to be inculcated among students are framed out before hand. The outcomes are delineated clearly, and the teaching plans outlined accordingly. This enhances the quality of education being imparted to them. Furthermore, resources are shared through e- learning platform to augment teaching learning in classrooms.
- **Distance Education /Online Education:** The institution has the provision of Open Education through its study centre of KKHSOU (Krishna Kanta Handique State Open University) and IDOL(Institute of Distance and Open Learning). This gives an opportunity of persuing higher education to all those students who could not get it through formal institution.

Strategic Plan on Curricular Aspects:

The following are proposals to improve the curricular aspects

Approach 1: To prepare a Roadmap for curricular reforms in a phased manner, focusing on multidisciplinary and holistic education with the vision of NEP-2020.

Approach 2: Introduce Certificate Course on life skills and value added courses such as Yoga and Meditation, Self Defence, Cutting and Tailoring, Spoken English, Personality Development, Anchoring and T.V host ,Beautician course and Indian Tradition of Knowledge will be introduced.



Approach 3: To uphold good academic performance continuously.

Approach 4: To introduce community-based courses and projects in vocational education programmes with the support of local artists, entrepreneurs, etc.

Approach 5 : Fostering Add-on courses on diverse topics for the benefit of the students in acquiring knowledge by different departments as well as through Massive Online Open Courses (MOOC) and SWAYAM offered by the national and international institution.

Strategic Plan on Teaching Learning and Evaluation:

The following are proposals to develop the learning outcomes of students

Approach 1: Modernization of existing class rooms.

• Developing all classrooms as ICT enabled classrooms

Approach 2: To plan effective mode of delivery of curriculum using ICT

- Conducting learning assessment test for students for identification of Active and slow learner.
- To strengthen remedial classes/ Tutorial classes to the weak students/slow learner in such subjects during evening hours. The services of faculty, guest faculty and experts from outside the institution will be utilized for the purpose
